**Principles of Neuroplasticity:

The remainder of the program will be organized around how these principles can be applied to interventions across treatment settings. Content will address the detrimental neurological effects of substance use following a neurological insult and the potential impact of neurological impact on employment and community mobility outcomes.

Prior to joining Mercy Health, Lynne was an Associate Clinical Faculty member in the Occupational Therapy Doctoral Program at The University of Toledo and Senior Clinician in the Department of Rehabilitation at the University of Toledo Medical Center, with a specialization in neurological rehabilitation.
