Dr. Victoria Kelly is a comprehensive adult psychiatrist who practices in northwest Ohio. As Clinical Assistant Professor, she is the Psychiatry Program Director and Psychiatry Co-Clerkship Director at the University of Toledo Medical Center, as well as a collaborative care psychiatrist through her joint appointment with the Family Practice Department. In addition, she practices forensic psychiatry at Unison Health, a community mental health center, working with individuals on conditional release. Dr. Kelly also has experience in the private sector, where she worked for several years at her concierge practice, Success and Wellness Associates.

She completed her undergraduate degree at Kent State University, her medical degree at Northeastern Ohio Medical University, and psychiatry training at the Ohio State University Medical Center. In addition to mood and anxiety disorders, Dr. Kelly has a special interest in personalized medicine in the treatment of psychiatric disorders, adult ADHD, women's health issues, pharmacogenomics, and the integration of psychotherapy with medication management.

She is active in community advocacy, serving as President-Elect for the Ohio Psychiatric Physicians Association, past President of the Northwest Ohio Psychiatric Physicians Association, and past President of National Alliance on Mental Illness of Greater Toledo.

Dr. Kelly is a renowned lecturer and has provided her expertise as a public speaker in many settings. She has presented around the country, at conferences on the national, state, and local level. Dr. Kelly is a well-respected educator and has been interviewed by print-media, while also appearing regularly on television as a monthly contributor to northwest Ohio's CBS station discussing various topics related to mental health & addictions to improve education, advocate for effective patient care, and decrease stigma associated with mental health disorders.
